IMPORTANT HEALTH INFORMATION/REQUIREMENT

Washington State Law requires that any child with a life-threatening condition have a medication or treatment order and nursing care plan at school before the child attends. The law defines “life-threatening condition” as “a health condition that will put the child in danger of death during the school day if a medication or treatment order and a nursing plan are not in place.” Examples of a life-threatening condition are severe allergy to bee sting or food, diabetes, and severe asthma. The medication or treatment order must come from the child’s licensed health care provider, and the school nurse will develop the nursing plan (health care plan).

If you have indicated on the Health Information Survey form that your child has a life-threatening condition, you will be given a packet with all forms that must be completed and returned to school before your child may attend. Please contact the school nurse and arrange to meet to develop a health care plan.

Note: Before a child with a life-threatening condition may attend school, the following must be in place at school:

- **A medication or treatment order from the child’s licensed health care provider**
- **All medication and/or supplies**
- **A health care plan developed by the school nurse and signed by the parent/guardian**
